### **OFFICE OF THE FEDERAL ENVIRONMENTAL EXECUTIVE TO HONOR OUTSTANDING FEDERAL ELECTRONICS STEWARDSHIP**

On April 17, 2007, Federal employees from across the United States will gather at the Eisenhower Executive Office building in Washington, D.C., to be honored for their outstanding electronics stewardship efforts. The awards ceremony will recognize Federal employees and facilities for leading by example by donating to local schools, reusing, or recycling their used computers and other electronic equipment.

The Office of the Federal Environmental Executive challenged Federal agencies for the second year to donate and recycle excess or surplus electronics through the Electronics Reuse and Recycling Campaign (ERRC). Starting on America Recycles Day, November 15, 2006, and for a four-month period, Federal facilities competed to see who could reuse and recycle the most computers and other electronics.

“Each Federal employee has the opportunity to make a significant contribution to promote the management of our electronic assets in an environmentally sound and energy efficient manner,” said Mr. Ed Piñero, the Federal Environmental Executive, who will present the awards to the winning facilities. “These voluntary efforts can collectively make a big difference by implementing practices, technological applications, and methodologies that will gain long term benefits for economic performance, energy efficiency, and our environmental and natural resource conservation efforts.”

A total of 14 winners were selected from 12 agencies and 124 facilities who participated in the Campaign. The program successfully reused and recycled approximately 2.4 million pounds of electronics. The Department of Energy will be receive the top honors for a second year in a row for reusing and recycling over 600,000 pounds of electronics from its 19 participating facilities.
