How Federal Agencies Can Comply with Energy-Efficiency Requirements for Office Equipment

Go to www.energystar.gov/fedofficeenergy and learn how:

- **The Energy Policy Act of 2005** (EPAAct) requires federal agencies to buy either ENERGY STAR qualified products, or products designated as energy efficient by the Federal Energy Management Program (FEMP).
- **Executive Order 13514 and 13423** mandate that federal agencies activate ENERGY STAR power management features on computers and monitors, and buy EPEAT-registered, ENERGY STAR qualified, and FEMP designated products.



Take the following 4 steps to comply:

- **Step 1: Purchase EPEAT Registered Computers and Monitors**
All EPEAT-registered products are, by definition, ENERGY STAR qualified. The current ENERGY STAR efficiency specifications for computers can save \$14 in electricity per year. Visit www.epeat.net for registered product lists and additional product requirements.
- **Step 2: Activate Power Management Features on Computers and Monitors**
Learn how computer power management, or “sleep” features can save your organization as much as \$75 per system annually. Instructions, software, savings calculators, and other resources are available at www.energystar.gov/powermanagement.
- **Step 3: Purchase ENERGY STAR Qualified Office Equipment**
Printers, copiers, all-in-one devices, and other ENERGY STAR qualified imaging products can save up to \$60 in electricity annually. For information on ENERGY STAR qualified products, visit www.energystar.gov/purchasing.
- **Step 4: Purchase FEMP-Designated Energy-Efficient Products**
The Department of Energy’s Federal Energy Management Program provides purchasing specifications for energy-efficient products not covered by ENERGY STAR. For additional information on FEMP-designated products, visit www1.eere.energy.gov/femp/procurement/.
